Our goals for 2017 are few and simplistic, so let's do all things well for the glory of God as we fulfill His command to go and make disciples. The goals for 2017 are as follows:

- Move forward with the building project at GBC
- Establish and actively participate in an inner city church partnership
  - This goal is presently moving forward as a few of our men are meeting with a new city church once a week and establishing relationships. As relationships are formed and trust built, more opportunities will be made available to more individuals to participate. This will be a long-term and slow process as this church is in its infancy and many are new believers.
- Canvass local neighborhoods (5000 door knockers to be handed out)
- 400 regular attendees with facilities and leadership to provide care
- 25 salvations
- 25 baptisms
- 25 new member
- Website improvement (as of this writing, this goal has been accomplished!)

Finally, the vision for Grace Baptist Church moving into 2017 and beyond includes the following:

- to share the Good News of Jesus Christ with the thousands of residents surrounding Grace Baptist Church
- to make Grace Baptist Church known to our neighbors

A Few Words From  
Pastor Jon:

*Matthew 10:1-4- Jesus called His twelve disciples to Him and gave them authority to drive out impure spirits and to heal every disease and*

*sickness. These are the names of the twelve apostles: first, Simon (who is called Peter) and his brother Andrew; James son of Zebedee, and his brother John; Philip and Bartholomew; Thomas and Matthew the tax collector; James son of Alphaeus, and Thaddaeus; Simon the Zealot and Judas Iscariot, who betrayed Him.*

When Jesus sent out “the twelve” to spread His Good News, He focused intently on equipping His disciples to go out and make disciples, and those disciples would then in-turn go and make other disciples, and so on. That’s how Christianity revolutionized the world!

For example, let’s look at the “persecuted Church” today (especially the Middle East). They meet in dark, secret places; sometimes even underground. They give their lives to make disciples and *all they have is the Spirit of God, the Word of God, and each other.* **Did you catch that?** *All they have is the Spirit of God, the Word of God, and each other.*

As followers/disciples of Christ, no matter where we are in the world and regardless of our conditions, we should have a like passion to know Him and see Him known. Let us be inspired by the “persecuted Church” and beg the Lord to light that fire within us.

It is so imperative that we get this. It is the individual believers that make up the Church of Jesus Christ. Sometimes in the west, we rely too heavily on programming, events, leaders, or the usual 10% of the body to do the work. Realize that Christ has commanded us **all** to be His hands and feet. Jesus did not make this optional for His followers. Additionally, this is not just a command—it is our calling, our purpose, our mission. Nothing is better than glorifying our Master and making much of Him with our lives!

Has He not given **all** believers His very Spirit to dwell within? As followers of Christ, we have to come to Him on HIS terms, not ours. If you ever hear anyone say that there is “nothing special about their testimony” what they are saying is (intentionally or unintentionally) that Jesus taking the sin of the world upon His shoulders was no big deal. However, THIS is the BIGGEST deal. EVERY testimony is a miracle and gift of God by His grace and one for which Jesus endured the cross and wrath of the Father.

Sometimes in the western Church, we get caught up and so busy in the “stuff” of the Church, that we neglect to magnify our mission and purpose as believers. The Biblical role of Church leaders is to shepherd and equip the saints to go out and multiply. As a result, the saints are to partner in this purpose. There should be **no one** on the sidelines. There should be **no “pew-huggers”** in the Church. I don’t know when it became popular to “pop in and out” on a Sunday morning and leave it at that. This is truly tragic and has become an epidemic.

What are you and I doing in between Sundays? Do we come to church simply to receive, or do we come to be equipped to go out into our neighborhoods, workplaces, places we hang out, to share what we’ve learned and build relationships? As Jesus so perfectly illustrated, relationships are the channel through how the gospel spreads to a lost world.

Please don’t miss this. As Christ-followers, our purpose is to give ourselves for the sake and glory of Christ. As long as we have breath God has us on mission. We are to die to ourselves and live for Him as He lives through us. It only takes a little spark to start a fire. Let’s rekindle afresh our mission in Christ. If we **all** do this together as a body, watch out for what will happen! Onward Christian soldiers!

#### “When does life begin?”

Scientific advances enable us to know the moment an egg is fertilized, when the embryo attaches to the lining of the uterus, and when a baby’s heart first beats in its mother’s womb. All the genetic information you and I possess existed at the moment of conception. All we will become is present from

the first instant that the mother's egg is fertilized by the father's sperm. This includes personality, body size, color of eyes and hair, basic intellect, etc. Science indicates that the baby's brain begins functioning enough to generate measurable brain waves (electroencephalographic [EEG] impulses) at 40 days. Additionally, the baby's facial muscles move, even appearing to form "smiles" as early as 12 weeks.

Leaders on both sides of the political debate acknowledge that science has uncovered many amazing things about human life, but science alone cannot settle the ultimate questions about the sanctity of life.

**Scripture Holds the Key to Understanding the Sanctity of Life**—Scripture undergirds the scientific data. As we look to God's Word, the ultimate source of truth, we see that God, the Creator of life, tells us when personhood begins. He also makes clear who holds the reins of life and death.


